Accent on Worship

Perhaps my mind is making connections that were never intended. Or more likely, the Holy Spirit is working in my mind to make connections that were perhaps not intended by those who prepared the lectionary but were completely intentional in Her infinite wisdom.

On January 1, at our liturgy for the Name of Jesus, we heard from Luke about Jesus being given his name, the name first given to Mary before he was conceived, eight days after his birth.

The next day, celebrating the Second Sunday of Christmas, we hear from John about the Word, Jesus, God themself, becoming flesh and living among us.

And this week, from Isaiah, we will hear, "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you... you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you..."

God, who is given a human name, comes to live, to dwell, with us and then call us by name and claim us as their very own. Words of great comfort, at least to me, and reminiscent of words I have spoken to my own children on many occasions (this recollection calls back to yet another experience in our recent liturgies where Pastor Crippen taught about our God as parent).

A couple times over the past months, my dear daughter found herself overwhelmed by some situations in her life and the release came in the form of tears while sitting in my lap. The specific situations were out

of her control (and out of my control as well), so there was very little that could be done to actually solve the things causing the overwhelming feelings.

While holding her in my arms, I found myself repeating things like, "You don't have to be afraid. We will do this together. You are my Elizabeth, my promise, my gift of God (recalling who she is, whose she is, and how she was named). No matter what happens, I will be with you (the promise of a daddy to his daughter). You are important to me (oh so important) and I love you (a statement of reality, of commitment, of relationship).

I didn't intend to be Biblical and I certainly was not quoting Biblical phrasing when comforting my daughter. They were my words. But they are also words from our parent God to his precious children.

Perhaps like me, you find comfort in the image of our parent God holding us in his arms, no matter the circumstances, and saying, "do not fear...I have called you by name, you are mine...I will be with you... you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you..."
