# Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that worship is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

An elevator to the lower and street levels can be found at the northwest corner of the education wing. Restrooms are located on the main floor and lower level. Turn right as you exit the narthex, then turn left. Restrooms are at the end of the hall, next to the elevator. Please ask an usher if you need assistance!

**Mount Olive is equipped with a hearing assist loop.** If you use a hearing aid equipped with a T-Coil, switch your device to T-Coil to access. If your aid does not have that option, small headsets are available. Ask an usher for assistance.

Helps for following the liturgy: Numbers marked with the word "page..." in small case are in the front portion of the hymnal at the bottom left and right corners of the page. Numbers marked with the word "HYMN..." are in the back portion of the hymnal in the upper left and right corners of the page. Note that the psalms are numbered as hymns 1-150. Hymns 901-1100 are found in the purple hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*, and are indicated as "ACS HYMN ..."

# Focus on the Season: Reformation Sunday, Lect. 31 C

Today Jesus invites himself to the home of a publicly ostracized "sinner." This day God invites us into grace, even though we do not deserve it. "Today salvation has come to this house." Like Zacchaeus, we stand as people overwhelmed by the love of God, transformed, reformed, to pour out our thanks and praise with our lives and wealth.

Today we also celebrate the Sunday of the Reformation, as is the custom in Lutheran churches. Reformation Day is Oct. 31, and on the previous Sunday to that day each year we celebrate the ongoing reformation of the whole catholic Church on earth. (Many years we use the lectionary assigned to Reformation Day on this Sunday. This year we are using the regular readings appointed for this Sunday in year C.) As Martin Luther, led by the Spirit, opened the Church to a new reality of grace in God, as Zacchaeus finds transformation and hope in the grace of the Son of God, so, too, we seek continuing reformation of our faith and life, both as Church, and individually.





#### The Commemorations

**October 31:** Reformation Day - By the end of the seventeenth century, many Lutheran churches celebrated a festival commemorating Martin Luther's posting of the Ninety-five Theses, a summary of abuses in the church of his time. At the heart of the reform movement was the gospel, the good news that it is by grace through faith that we are justified and set free.

**November 1:** All Saints Day - The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century. All Saints Day celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who make up the body of Christ. On this day or the following Sunday, many congregations will remember the faithful who have died during the past year.

**November 3:** Martín de Porres, renewer of society, died 1639 - Martín was the son of a Spanish knight and a freed black slave from Panama. As a lay brother in the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), he engaged in many charitable works in Lima, Peru. He founded an orphanage, a hospital, and a clinic for cats and dogs.
