Being the presence of God.

Be still

Our familiar friend Psalm 46, whom we know from Reformation Sunday these many years, is given to us to sing this Sunday as well. "God is our refuge and strength," the psalmist sings. "A mighty fortress is our God," Luther replies (but in German). This psalm is full of images such as Jesus declared last week: earth moving, mountains under the ocean quaking, tsunamis, raging nations. It is a loud psalm for a loud world.

And then God says, "Be still, and know that I am God."

Can we find stillness in our trust in God in these loud days of quaking and raging? With radios and TVs and smartphones and all the other noises of a modern life, is there any time when you have silence? Sit in a space to breathe, and listen for God?

In our Eucharist, we have several places of silence, the longest being between the preaching and the congregation's singing of God's Word for the day. Every second of silence in our worship is a precious pearl to be sought and embraced.

Be still, God says, so you can know God is God. Can you find stillness in your day? A time for contemplation where you set aside all other noise and entertainment and news and chatter? God promises that, even when the whole world is falling apart noisily, that if you can be still and listen, you will know God, and then you will know your refuge and help. That seems worth taking time for.


The Book Discussion group meets on the second Saturday of each month at 10 am at church. All readers are welcome!

The next Beacon Interfaith Congregational Convening will happen on December 1 at 6:30 pm at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Saint Paul.

Congregational Convenings are a chance for those connected to Beacon member congregations - that includes Mount Olive - to meet together and learn about some very important actions we can take together to encourage our elected leaders to take action on important issues related to homelessness and affordable housing in the Twin Cities. At this particular gathering, Beacon leaders will share more about their five year plan and some of the affordable housing projects they are current working on, many of which Mount Olive has been supporting financially and though advocacy efforts. They will also be sharing more about their work on some comprehensive voucher programs, which if implemented, could drastically change the face of affordable housing in the Twin Cities.

From Emily and Kate, the Minneapolis Area Organizers for Beacon: "Beacon leaders worked this summer and fall to build relationships with candidates of both major parties so that we can start 2023 with electeds ready to work for the vision that all people have a home! With election night behind us, it's time to look forward to a legislative session with tremendous potential for investment in our vision that all people have a home."

You all have shown you have a heart for issues related to housing our neighbors - attending events like this is one more way to put that heart into action - and learn about more ways you can help provide housing for those in our communities.

The indigenous roots of restorative justice focus on transformation of people, relationships, and community. In honoring these roots, RJCA humanizes conflict and supports community in finding shared solutions.
