# Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that worship is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

An elevator to the lower and street levels can be found at the northwest corner of the education wing. Restrooms are located on the main floor and lower level. Turn right as you exit the narthex, then turn left. Restrooms are at the end of the hall, next to the elevator. Please ask an usher if you need assistance!

**Mount Olive is equipped with a hearing assist loop.** If you use a hearing aid equipped with a T-Coil, switch your device to T-Coil to access. If your aid does not have that option, small headsets are available. Ask an usher for assistance.

**Helps for following the liturgy:** Numbers marked with the word "page..." in small case are in the front portion of the hymnal at the bottom left and right corners of the page. Numbers marked with the word "HYMN..." are in the back portion of the hymnal in the upper left and right corners of the page. Note that the psalms are numbered as hymns 1-150.

**Hymns 901-1100** are found in the purple hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*, and are indicated as "ACS HYMN ..."

## Focus on the Season: 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost, Lect. 23 A

Life in Christian community is a precious thing, but it can break down when we treat each other with less than Christly love. Today, Jesus prescribes a manner for dealing with conflict in community life, a procedure reflected in many congregations' constitutions. Jesus' intent, clearly shaped by his parable of the sheep who "go astray", is that through this hard, loving work people can be loved back into the life of the community.


## The Commemorations

**September 13:** *St. John Chrysostom, Bishop of Constantinople, died 407* - John was a priest in Antioch and an outstanding preacher. His eloquence earned him the nickname "Chrysostom" ("golden mouth"). Appointed bishop of Constantinople, seat of the empire, he criticized corruption in the court. As a result, he was exiled by the empress.

**September 14:** Holy Cross Day - Helena, mother of Constantine, made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and found what may be the actual site of Jesus' crucifixion. Her son built two churches there, and the dedication of one of them gave rise to this celebration of our Lord's victory on the cross.

# Mount Olive celebrates this feast with a liturgy this Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m.

**September 16:** *St. Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage, martyr, died around 258* - Cyprian served as a bishop during a time of great persecution of Christians. He insisted on receiving back those who had left the faith under duress. He also provided medical care during a severe epidemic.
