Welcome to Worship at Mount Olive!

Mount Olive is a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and a Reconciling in Christ congregation. It is a community in and of the city where all are welcome in every aspect of congregational life. We believe that the liturgy is central to our life together, that our weekly gathering around Word and Sacrament strengthens us for our work as people of God in this and in every place.

Following the Liturgy

- *Page*: Numbers marked "page ..." are in the front of the cranberry red hymnal in the lower outside corners of the pages.
- *HYMN*: Numbers marked "HYMN ..." are in the back of the cranberry red hymnal in the upper outside corners of the pages.
- Psalms are numbered as hymns 1–150.
- *Hymns numbered 901–1100*, marked "ACS HYMN ...," are in the purple hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*.

Accessibility

- An *elevator* is located at the north entry. Turn right as you exit the nave.
- A large *unisex restroom* is located on the lower level (across the hall from the elevator).
- Primary restrooms are located on the main floor near the elevator.
- Additional parking is available on Sunday mornings behind the Career Force center at the corner of Chicago Ave. and Lake St.

"The Sabbath was made for humanity and not humanity for the Sabbath," Jesus says, to people who criticized him for healing on the Sabbath day. The Sabbath is God's command arising from God's deep desire for us to be rested, refreshed, for us not to work ourselves to the bone. The Sabbath was made for us, Jesus says. 





The Commemorations

June 3: *The Martyrs of Uganda, died 1886* - On June 3, 1886, thirty-two young men were burned to death for refusing to renounce Christianity. The confident manner in which these Christians went to their deaths contributed to a much stronger Christian presence in Uganda.

June 3: *St. John XXIII, Bishop of Rome, died 1963* - When elected pope, the former Angelo Roncalli was expected to be a short-term caretaker. He showed great spirit, though, and convened the Second Vatican Council which helped bring great changes to Roman Catholic and other churches.

June 5: *St. Boniface, Bishop of Mainz, missionary to Germany, martyr, died 754* - Boniface was a native of England who became a Benedictine monk and was called to missionary work among the Vandal tribes of Germany. With fellow workers, he established churches and schools, and he also worked to reform the church.

June 7: Seattle, chief of the Duwamish Confederacy, died 1866 - Noah Seattle led a coalition of tribes, and convinced them to live peacefully with encroaching white settlers. When he became a Roman Catholic, he held morning and evening prayer with his tribe. The city of Seattle is named for him.
