Accent on Worship Cantor David Cherwien

Set us On Fire With Your Love

I have a permanent association with Pentecost Sunday.

Pentecost Sunday of 2020 was the weekend of the protests in connection with George Floyd's murder. There were three nights of unrest, fires everywhere. Each morning I got up and looked east from my house (from which I could sometimes see the Midtown Market tower) and I'd see plumes of smoke rising. In addition to feeling for folks and businesses who were losing their places, I worried for our building. Early each of those days, like 7:00 a.m., I hopped into the car to come and see, and to assess if there was anything I could do.

That morning I arrived to find the buildings on the north side of Lake Street and the corner of Lake and Chicago on fire. I met up with then-congregational-president Gretchen Campbell-Johnson and we sobbed. Residents were standing with us in horror as we watched their buildings burn. The streets were full of National Guard officers. Firefighters were there to try to stop the flames, but the buildings were a total loss. It was a surreal morning.

I kept thinking of the imagery of Pentecost Sunday, its lessons, and in the hymnody. The primary image is tongues of fire appearing on apostle's heads. The Gospel Acclamation reads "Alleluia. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people, set them on fire with your love. Alleluia." This is our calling, I thought. Transform the fire of rage into fire of love. This is the work of the Spirit.

Another hymn concludes with its final stanza, "Widen our love, good Spirit, to embrace in your strong care all those of every race. Like wind and fire with life among us move, till we are known as Christ's and Christians prove." This hymn is no longer in our hymnal, unfortunately – but was LBW 160, "Filled With the Spirit's Power." So: Yes. Yes. Yes. I love what it says. This Sunday, we are invited to be just that: known as Christ's, spreading love. This is the work of the Spirit.

By the way, our building was fine – thanks to some vigilant neighbors across Chicago Ave. who kept people away. That too, was love.

From your Vestry, regarding the Cantor of Mount Olive

As we now know of Cantor David Cherwien's impending retirement, the Vestry wants to keep our community informed as we walk with David and with each other through this transition, and into the next part of the journey on which God is leading us.

The Vestry has set up a small task group to plan and dream and envision our farewell to David, what the celebration will be and look like, and all those details. The Vestry has also set up a small group to discern how we will be led in worship from the organ and choir loft during this transition. Clearly an interim will be needed while we engage in our search for the next cantor. The hope is that an interim will be chosen and announced by late June or early July.

Last, the Vestry has decided to have a call committee elected for the searching and discerning and calling of our next cantor. That process, which culminates in a congregational meeting where the call committee of seven members is elected, will begin in August.

It's not possible to know how long the interim period will last. It will largely depend on the call committee and their process, and how it all flows. But we know in all of this that God is with Mount Olive, with Cantor Cherwien as he moves into this time of retirement, with those who will lead us in our transition, and with the one who will one day come among us as cantor. As more things are known, they will be announced to the congregation.

Two-Fold Neighborhood Ministry Request

At our recent congregational meeting, I had the opportunity to share a number of things happening in Neighborhood Ministry, including our advocacy efforts, the opportunities offered by our direct service programs, our connections with many new arrivals from Central and South America, and our unique diaper program.

At that meeting, I ended my report with a two-fold request.

One, we are looking for people to volunteer in a new role we are calling Neighborhood Ministry Host. People in this role would agree to serve at least one time per month, offering hospitality to people coming to Mount Olive for our direct service programs. Volunteers in this role will also be trained to assist people with bus cards, laundry vouchers, and some of our more basic offerings. Volunteers in this role can serve on their own schedule, any day Monday though Thursday, but Tuesdays and Thursdays are our busiest days and the days we have the most need for volunteer support. Please contact me if you are interested in more information.

Two, because of increased demand and increased costs, we are looking for additional donations to support our diaper program. We are seeking additional support in the amount of \$15,000 to help us through the remainder of 2024. Our diaper program leadership group has been working on a number of plans to reduce costs, solicit donations of diapers, apply for grants, and establish new partnerships. But many of those plans will not be realized until later in 2024 or even into the beginning of 2025, hence the request for additional donations from the Mount Olive community. Any additional donations to our diaper program can be made by simply writing "Diaper Depot" on the memo line of a check, using your pink Neighborhood Ministry envelope, or using the direct Neighborhood Ministry donation link on the Mount Olive website.
