June 30, 2024 6th Sunday after Pentecost Lect.13 B Lamentations 3:22-33 Psalm 30 2 Corinthians 8:7-15 Mark 5:21-43

In the presence of God. Being the presence of God. As we continue this week through our sequential reading of 2nd Corinthians, we come upon a very familiar passage. You might be feeling the phantom of soot and oil on your forehead as you encounter this text, because you have heard most of it (verses 1-10) every year on Ash Wednesday. And every Vespers Liturgy during Lent begins with Paul's hopeful exclamation from verse 2: "Behold, now is the acceptable time; now is the day of salvation."

Paul is quoting Isaiah 49:8, and is recalling the acceptable time, the day of salvation that marked the end of the Exile, when in 538 b.c.e., those Jews who had been held in captivity in Babylon were finally allowed to return home. Paul is drawing on that memory of jubilation and restoration to entreat the Corinthians to open their hearts wide to the joy of sustaining faith in the goodness of God. It makes for a strangely hopeful, even triumphant, text for Lent, and I'm glad we get to hear it again this week.

This passage also resonates with me for a different reason. Madeleine L'Engle's spiritual science fiction novels were some of my absolute favorite books in middle school and the last novel in the *A Wrinkle in Time* quintet is called "*An Acceptable Time*"--an allusion to this text. So whenever I hear that phrase, my mind conjures up Polly O'Keefe and her time-bending encounter with the People of the Wind. And one of my favorite lines from the book is: "One theory I find rather comforting is that time exists so that everything doesn't happen all at once."

There are moments when I lament being stuck in time, when I rage against God's timing. Why hasn't God acted yet? How long do I have to wait? What's happening now? But I am also comforted by this theory: that time is a gift, so that everything doesn't happen all at once. Without time, there would be no memories of the past that I could summon to sustain me in times of trouble. There would be no patience in the present, no hope for the future. Without time, we wouldn't be able to experience how God has made and will make all things new, how God transforms even our darkest moments into days of salvation. Paul and Madeleine's writing reminds us that it is not ours to discern why a certain time may be acceptable, but to experience how God can turn any time, even a time with the deepest wrinkles, into an acceptable time.

Adult Forum: This Sunday, June 23

June 23 - Beyond Affirmation: LGBTQIA2S+ Lives as Sources of Sacred Wisdom: Many churches have practiced affirmation for LGBTQIA2S+ people for many years now. But what exists beyond affirmation? This forum will help orient our focus with a posture of compassionate curiosity to ask what we can learn from queer and trans lives that would benefit the whole church. What stories need to be told of queer and trans faithfulness, community, love, and courage that we all need to hear? What lessons have LGBTQIA2S+ people learned at the margins of many communities that we would all do well to learn? Beyond "affirmation," we have the potential to learn from queer and trans lives as sources of sacred wisdom, to reincorporate parts of the larger church's story from which we have been cut off, and to celebrate the gifts that LGBTQIA2S+ people have been and continue to be for the church and the wider world.

The Rev. Cody J. Sanders, Ph.D., is Associate Professor of Congregational & Community Care Leadership at Luther Seminary. His books include, *Queer Lessons for Churches on the Straight and Narrow* (translated into Japanese and Swahili), *Microaggressions in Ministry* (with Angela Yarber, translated into Japanese), *A Brief Guide to Ministry with LGBTQIA Youth*, and *Christianity*, *LGBTQ Suicide, and the Souls of Queer Folk* (subject of the 2024 Biopsychosocial-Spiritual Research Conference at Loma Linda University in April of this year). He lives with his partner, also named Cody, in Saint Paul.

Parish House Flat Roof Work Underway

The work to replace the hail damaged flat roof on the Parish House has begun.

On Wednesday, June 12 - Powerfully Green was on site to remove the solar panels. They staged the panels, blocks, and racks on the concrete pad along the alley on the east side of the church. This work was completed on June 13th.

This week *weather permitting*, Roof Tech will be on site to start the removal and replacement of the PVC roof membrane. They will bring their own dumpster which will be placed in the north parking lot. They will also have a crane but do not anticipate needing to leave it overnight. They also bring a porta potty onsite so there is no need for access to the building.



Estimated completion date is unknown at this time. Watch for updates as the work progresses.

After the roof membrane work is completed, Powerfully Green will be back onsite to replace the solar panels.

NOTE: The parking in the north lot will be very limited during this work.
