#### No more division?

Paul gives a breathtaking promise in the portion of Ephesians we'll hear this Sunday. "Christ is our peace; in his flesh Christ has made both into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us . . . that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of two, thus making peace."

Paul is talking about the beautiful vision Christ gave him that both Jews and non-Jews could be one together in Christ, a vision he tried to instill in his congregations around the Mediterranean basin, but one that struggled to take flight even then.

But what if – even in these terribly polarized times – this vision isn't a false hope? Could Christ break down the hostilities between peoples in this country, between peoples in the wars raging around the world? We can scoff that it's a pipedream, unrealistic. But can we humans argue that we have any idea what we're doing, given the state of things?

Most of the polarizing, hostility, and division in our country and world seems far too entrenched and complex for you or for me even to know what we could do. But Paul says it's a God-sized problem, and God at the cross has already begun dealing with it. What if we trusted that, prayed for that? It would mean we pray that our own hostilities toward others be broken down, that we ourselves be led to peace with whomever it is we see as enemy. That will be hard. But is there any other way to end the violence and hate dominating our world?

God changing hearts, starting with yours and mine, seems the only way that can possibly bring healing and hope. Paul thinks so, too. What if we learned to trust Christ in this?

#### Vestry names interim staff for Cantor transition

The Vestry is pleased to announce who will lead us in worship as we begin our search for the next cantor of Mount Olive. There will be two positions. Serving as interim organist will be Robert Buckley Farlee, and serving as interim Cantorei director will be Andrew Stoebig. Together, they will be roughly 3/4 of the cantor position. Both are members of Mount Olive. Bob was the long-time cantor at Christ Church Lutheran in south Minneapolis and is retired. Andrew is a musicologist working on his Ph.D. and has studied choral conducting with Kathy Romey at the University of Minnesota. Both have substituted for Cantor Cherwien several times in recent years, at the organ and with the choir respectively.

Bob will begin playing at liturgies on the feast day of St. Mary, Mother of Our Lord (Aug. 15), and Andrew will begin his duties Aug. 1. Reid Peterson will be substitute organist on Aug. 4 and 11.

We are grateful to God for providing these gifted servants to lead us during this time of transition!

A few years ago, our Vestry approved sponsoring her to join the family our congregation assisted starting in 2021.

Long story short, she has received her visa and passport after winning the lottery and traveling with her brother to Islamabad, Pakistan for the interview at the USA embassy.

The Global Ministry Committee is forming a welcome team of members to mentor Yasamin and Milad as they settle into married life, find an apartment and fill it with furniture and kitchen supplies, get signed up for English classes, etc. Judy Hinck has even volunteered to teach her how to drive a car, as she did with Anita this past year!
