This weekend is one of those tiring weekends pastors sometime have, a “three sermon” weekend. We have Eucharist Saturday night, the feast of St. Mary, mother of our Lord, and we gather, “as is our custom,” as the Scriptures say about Jesus’ and Paul’s spiritual practices, this Sunday morning for Eucharist. On Monday I’ve been asked to preach out of town at the funeral of a long-time friend.

It will be tiring. But as I anticipate those three days, they seem more a hopeful statement on our life as Christ’s people. We will gather of a Saturday night to celebrate our sister Mary, who made God’s Incarnation in Jesus possible, and to be fed by God’s Word and Sacrament. Our Sunday morning worship and time together are the lifeblood of our community, and most of us wouldn’t miss it unless absolutely necessary. And gathering with other believers in grief and pain to hear what God has to say and be for us in the time of a loved one’s death is a holy joy, even amidst the tears.

This weekend reminds me what you all know: we gather to worship the Triune God because it is life for us, no matter if it is a time of joy or sorrow, or just ordinary time where we are walking with God through this life. What a privilege this gift of Christ is, the Church which carries our worship life and carries us out into the world as Christ’s love, fed, strengthened, and renewed for our ministry. Thank you for sharing this life with me!

they live in Bloomington with their young son. Her hobbies are things like organic gardening (growing most of the vegetables the family eats), fiber arts of all kinds (e.g. knitting, sewing, crocheting, weaving), and outdoor activities like hiking.

Neighborhood Ministries Partner of the Month: Simpson Housing



Simpson Housing is a multifaceted organization, providing an emergency shelter, single adult supportive housing, and family supportive housing across the Twin Cities metro area. They provide developmental and educational services for children of families in their family shelter program and “work across the metro area partnering with landlords and developers to find sustainable housing for families and individuals.” In addition, Simpson operates the Adult Shelter Connect program for Hennepin County, providing a single point of contact for those seeking shelter throughout the county.

This year, Simpson dedicated their new building, Simpson Community Shelter and Apartments. This new five-story facility includes emergency shelter, permanent supportive housing, food service spaces, community rooms, offices and clinic space.

Disaster Relief for Wildfires

The Mount Olive Global Ministry Committee has approved a \$2,000 donation to Lutheran World Relief from the Global Ministry undesignated offerings for urgent support for those affected by the wildfires in Spokane, Washington and other parts of the U.S. In Spokane, wildfires have destroyed over 700 homes, churches and workplaces. Thousands of acres of forest have been lost so far, and the fires are still not contained.



Lutheran World Relief is distributing emergency supplies to help families survive the immediate crisis. They will also support debris removal and cleanup. Indigenous Justice

One of our goals for the Indigenous justice part of the Justice Ministry committee is to partner with a program serving Indigenous people. To prepare for that, we recognize the need for learning and more in-depth understanding of Indigenous cultures, perspectives and norms of respectful behavior.

In the spirit of learning more and experiencing a significant cultural event, we're offering an opportunity to attend part of the upcoming Wacipi (powwow) at the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community in Prior Lake on **Saturday, August 15**. We're planning on getting a group from Mount Olive to attend it together. We'll try to leave Mount Olive about 12:15 and return around 4:00. We'll be there to see one of the grand entries, some of the dancing, art at the vendor tables and try some food. This is the main powwow for the nearest Dakota band, and it has its own website, www.smscwacipi.org



Here's a brief description of the event from the Wacipi website:

"Representing dozens of tribes from across the United States and Canada, dancers dressed in traditional regalia compete for top honors in various dance style categories and age groups, while drum groups and singers surround the perimeter of the arena. Native American artists and crafters display traditional beadwork, jewelry, and handmade goods, while food vendors offer a variety of tasty, authentic meals and treats."

On the brick wall you’ll see Marjorie Ford Pohlmann Sethna’s design for the project. If you find the display case unlit, just press the floor switch. You’re also welcome to enter the chancel after any liturgy to view the kneelers, but allow the day’s servants time to complete their tasks.

Opportunities to Serve on the Neighborhood Ministry Team

We are looking to add people to two of the teams serving in Neighborhood Ministry.

Diaper Depot Driver

We could use at least one more driver for the Diaper Depot to lighten the load on our existing drivers. Each driver delivers diapers to between 4-6 families each week on Wednesday afternoons. Routes are planned to minimize the distance between each stop.

Neighborhood Ministry Host

We would like to add to our core of servants working with our neighborhood ministry guests during the week. We have a wonderful group of people that allows us to have 2-3 people here for the times we are open, but it often gets busy and adding to this team would be a great help. Neighborhood Ministry hosts serve from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. Most servants choose one of those days – and although some choose to work more than one – there is no expectation that anyone serve more than one day a week. A Neighborhood Ministry Host serves by greeting our guests, assisting them with bus cards, laundry vouchers, obtaining vital records, and listening to guests' stories. Training and mentorship with current hosts will be provided for anyone wanting to serve.

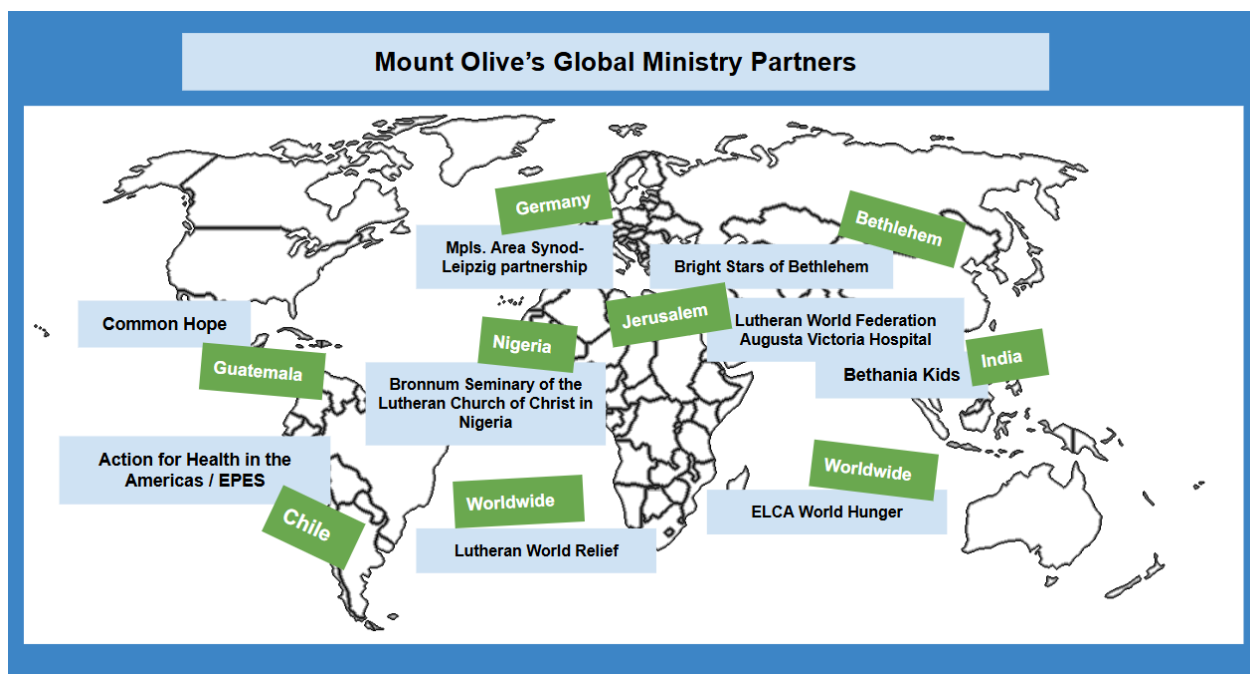

Global Ministry at Mount Olive

Mount Olive tithes 12% of its regular giving to other ministries. 4% goes to the ELCA/Minneapolis Area Synod, 4% goes to Neighborhood Ministries, and 4% goes to Global Ministries. The Global Ministry committee decides which global ministry partners to support and facilitates relationships with those partners and the people of Mount Olive.

We believe we need to be good stewards of this congregational support. Before we propose a budget to the Vestry, we rate each of our current partners and any possible new partners, using our criteria. The criteria include; Faith, Connection to the Church at Large, Connection to Mount Olive, Diversity, and Accountability. More detail can be found in this link. We work to be and to encounter the presence of Christ beyond our neighborhood through prayers, hands-on work, advocacy, and financial support.

In addition to these ministry partners, we mentor two families from Afghanistan and respond to other needs around the world as they arise. 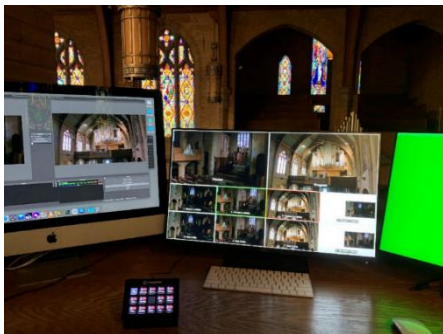

Help with Live Streaming



We are in need of a couple more helpers to run the live stream during worship. You'll need to be comfortable using a computer, and to follow along with the liturgy to switch cameras in response to what's happening where.

What you'll do as a live streamer: Get situated at the computer in the South Gallery and start the live stream a few minutes before the prelude begins. Follow along with the liturgy, and when we come to a transition point (examples: a reader walks to the lectern, or a hymn is about to begin), you press a couple buttons to switch to the correct camera, move camera positions, and/or display overlay slides with music on them.

Training sessions and written directions are available. An experienced streamer will sit by you and assist you for your first services. A New Voice Comes to Mount Olive

A Flentrop/Dobson organ has recently joined the other instruments in the south transept. It is a one-manual, three-stop chamber organ patterned after instruments found in many northern European homes in the 17th and 18th centuries.

It was originally built for the chapel at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC). In January of 1979, Mount Olive's then cantor, Paul Manz flew to Chicago to play the first Epiphany Vespers at Rockefeller Chapel, which raised money to purchase the organ from Flentrop Orgelbau of the Netherlands. The instrument was assembled and finished by then-seminarian Art and Elaine Halbardier.

The small organ accompanied daily worship until 1988, when Christ Seminary (Seminex) of Saint Louis merged with LSTC, bringing to Chicago faculty, students, and the Christ Seminary organ. This larger instrument was chosen for use in the chapel. The small Flentrop organ was loaned to a local congregation for several years but eventually was returned to the seminary. At some point, the instrument had been badly damaged while being moved and so was placed in storage in the seminary basement.

In 1996, Paul Manz, now faculty at LSTC, became aware of the extensive damage to the small organ. Paul contacted Art and Elaine with an offer to acquire the instrument, as resources were not present for its repair at the seminary.

Over several years, they did get the organ into reasonable playing condition again. A new, more elaborate case of cherry and walnut was constructed. It lived in their home until 2014 when they moved to a condo in the city.

Now lacking room for it, Art and Elaine gave the organ to Marc Levine and Tami Morse for their new Baroque Room performance space in Saint Paul. To prepare the instrument for use with professional ensembles, the Dobson Organ Company was engaged to do an extensive rebuild of it, replacing many damaged pipes, and revoicing the instrument. It was used extensively until the COVID-19 pandemic brought the ten-year series of Baroque Room concerts to an end.

Since the pandemic, the organ has stood silent in the Baroque Room. This spring, Tami, Marc, Art and Elaine offered the organ to Mount Olive as a gift. Volunteers from Mount Olive disassembled, packed, and moved the instrument. It has been reassembled in the south transept, and will be ready by fall to support singing of choirs, soloists, and with instrumental groups.
